**MEDIA NOTE: Local health departments and other community-based organizations that are part of the HIV/AIDS Network of Southwest Florida (HANS) will offer free educational and HIV testing events as part of the first local observance of National Caribbean American HIV and AIDS Awareness Day. A schedule of those offerings is at the end of this release.**

## **Free local health events planned for Caribbean Americans**

Local organizations working year-round to reduce the impact of HIV and AIDS in Southwest Florida will be sponsoring many free events during the week of June 9-16 in observance of the first annual National Caribbean American HIV and AIDS Awareness Day.

There will be a free event outside the Columbia Restaurant at 411 St. Armands Circle on Friday, June 11, from 10 a.m.- 3 p.m. The event will feature live entertainment provided by a drummer. In addition, the Sarasota County Health Department's Health In Motion Mobile Medical Unit will be on-site for HIV rapid testing (with preliminary test results available in 20 minutes) as well as syphilis and gonorrhea screenings, cholesterol and blood sugar testing and educational information. In addition, a Wings of Faith Health and Education Expo will take place on Saturday, June 12, from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. at Koinonia Missionary Baptist Church, 409 N. Lime Ave., Sarasota. The Manatee County Health Department's HIV Prevention Van will be on hand for free HIV screening, testing and education. Diabetes (blood sugar) and prostate screening also will be available.

Dr. Garth Graham, the Jamaican-born head of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Office of Minority Health, said "it is time to call all Caribbean communities in the U.S. to step up the fight against HIV/AIDS." This nationwide observance encourages Caribbean Americans to talk about HIV/AIDS, get tested and get into care if they have HIV, according to Dr. Graham. "For my family in Jamaica and my fellow Caribbean natives living in the U.S., no matter what your origin, this is an opportunity to take action against HIV," he added.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), people of color now account for a greater proportion of HIV and AIDS cases reported. AIDS is the leading cause of death among adults under the age of 44.

Poor health, premature death, and HIV and AIDS have challenged the extended Caribbean-American family in the United States. The Caribbean region, which can include Latin America, Bahamas, Trinidad, Tobago, Cuba, Puerto Rico, Jamaica, Haiti, Barbados and the Dominican Republic, is second only to sub-Saharan Africa in its rate

of HIV infection. These countries have a high rate of migration so the availability of HIV and AIDS data makes it difficult to gain a clear picture of each country's situation. However, in 2008, the United Nations estimated over 260,000 persons are living with HIV and AIDS in the Caribbean, making it one of the leading causes of death in some of these countries, with Haiti being the worst affected.

An estimated 7,500 lives are lost each year to AIDS in Haiti with thousands of children orphaned by the epidemic. Prior to Haiti's earthquake, there were signs that HIV infection was decreasing partially as a result of changes in sexual behavior and increased condom use. Since the earthquake in Haiti, medication used in HIV prevention, treatment and care has been in short supply.

HIV testing is fast and easy. "If you have never been tested, or have had unprotected sex or shared a needle since your last test, now is the time to get an HIV test – it's the only way to be sure," says Dr. Lisa Merritt, executive director of the Multicultural Health Institute which serves Manatee and Sarasota counties. "We urge Caribbean Americans to take time to learn more about HIV and AIDS, get tested and treated, and get involved in the events planned at one of the sites listed below."

Locally, the HIV/AIDS Network of Southwest Florida works to raise awareness about HIV and AIDS at the grass-roots community level. The group meets monthly to coordinate HIV and AIDS prevention and outreach services throughout the region.
