

**American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009  
Sarasota County Government Funding Status Report  
January 2010**

Sarasota County Government has been notified by state and federal agencies of different allocations we will be receiving through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. Below is a list of the funds that we are expecting to receive as a result of discretionary or formula grants that have already been announced as well as any competitive grants that we have received notification of award.

The final three grants on the list will impact Sarasota County and are being submitted by direct service partners of Sarasota County (NSP II by the City of Sarasota Office of Housing and Prevention & Wellness Initiative grant by the Florida Department of Health-Sarasota County).
