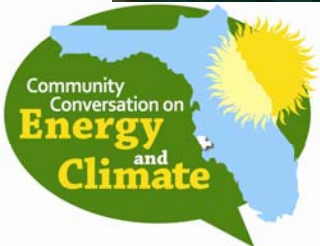

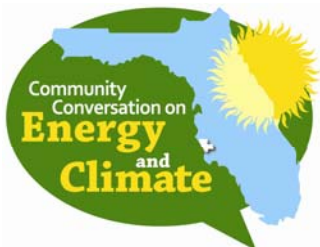

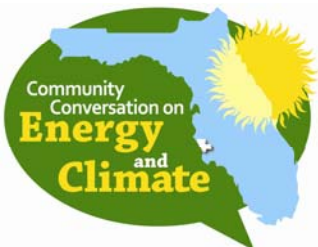
Using the Audience Response System

- Look for the solid GREEN light on the keypad to ensure that your response has been counted.



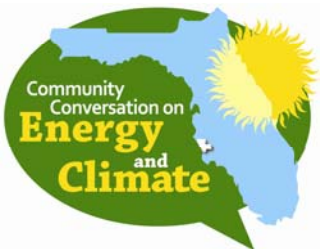
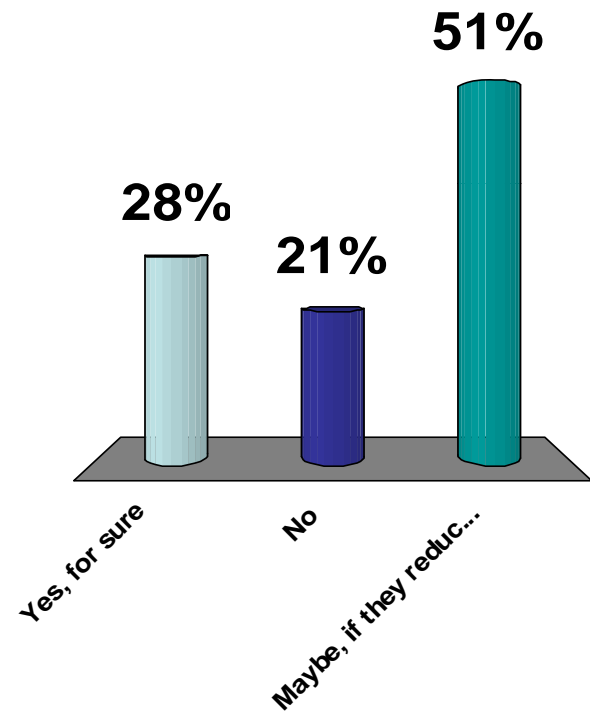
Using the Audience Response System

Top 5 Ideas
