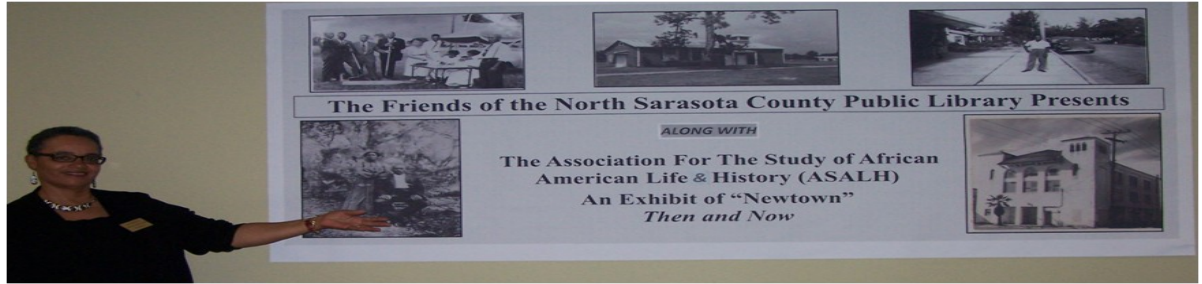

Greetings! The Friends of the North Sarasota Public Library have continued to be very busy during the past year. We have held “fun” fundraisers and supported outstanding children’s programs such as the annual Bike Rodeo, a new character education program, Christmas and Kwanzaa activities, and authors’ events. Bookstore sales events have increased our revenues, which are used to support many of the children’s activities at the library. Under the auspices of the soon-to-be established Cultural Resource Center and co-sponsored by the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASALH), we staged a second major Black History Exhibition, “Newtown: Then and Now.” This exhibition celebrated and honored the history of Black people in Sarasota, as well as the vibrancy of its revitalization. We continue to enjoy a mutually beneficial relationship with our library manager, Yvette Robison and her dynamic staff who support our efforts as we support the many new and exciting programs and activities they have developed. Through the efforts of Mrs. Robison and her staff, connections have been made with the local schools in order to encourage more children and families to participate in library programs, including after-school tutoring and cultural enrichment events. We have upgraded our hardware and software as we move the Friends into using the technologies of the 21st Century. We will also soon be employing social media outlets for marketing and communication.

The concept of a Cultural Resource Center at the North County Library was presented to the Friends Board the first year that the library was opened. Board members Lovette W. Harper and Warren Eastman chaired a committee that researched and then presented a document to the Friends Board and the Library Manager outlining the vision and mission, as well as suggested beginning resources for the Center. Committee members Betty Johnson and Lonnie Brookins contributed to the discussions and preparation of the document. The NSPL Friends Board agreed to the Vision and Mission for the Cultural Resource Center:

“A center in the North Sarasota Public Library which will serve Sarasota and surrounding counties as a reference, research facility for materials on all aspects of the Black experience...The Center will contain comprehensive reference collections, comprising books, periodicals, theses and dissertations, videos, cassettes, DVD’s CD’s and limited collections of photographs, posters, prints, paintings, and sculpture. It will provide outreach to the extended community through lectures, classes, youth programs and exhibitions.”

The Friends Board, constituting a Cultural Center Task Force, has mounted two annual exhibitions and developed programs that were widely supported by both the local and broader communities of Sarasota County.

This year's exhibition and programs were entitled "Newtown Then and Now." They attempt to tell much of the early history of Black people in Sarasota. The Exhibition and panel also highlighted current history as well, especially the many positive service projects being carried out by Newtown youth. The opening Reception was held on February 3, 2011 and was attended by a standing-room only, highly enthusiastic audience.

The Friends of the NSPL held two fun and interactive fundraisers this past year. Both events were suggested by two of our volunteers who worked with us to make them happen.



Painting Party

The first was a "Painting Party" suggested and implemented by Elaine Gambill, one of our volunteers and a principal in the painting party company "Canvas and Cork" now known as "Joni's Painting Party". The fundraiser was held on November 14, 2010 at the Canvas n Cork" gallery. Elaine and Joni DiPirro, local artists, teach non-artists to paint using the demonstration method. Every participant paints the same picture, demonstrated by one of the artists; all are given step-by-step instructions for each part of the painting. A picture custom-made for the Friends was designed by Joni DiPirro.

The "cork" aspect of the party is the provision of wine, soft drinks and snacks enjoyed by the "artists" while they work on their masterpieces. The camaraderie in the group as all learned together was a highlight of the experience. In 2 - 3 hours, everyone walked away with a completed picture. The event was so successful people are coming back for more and others who missed it want to come to paint. We will be making announcements for the next session sometime in the future. Bridge Party



The second fundraiser was a Bridge Party suggested by one of our Bookstore volunteers, Adele Garrison, who is an avid bridge player and a director for the American Bridge Association (ABA) group in Sarasota. The Bridge Party was held on

January 29, 2011 at the library. Adele directed the game. Equipment and bridge supplies were provided by the Sarasota Duplicate Bridge Club whose president is Edwin Garrison, Adele's husband. Refreshments were provided by the Friends. Forty participants played duplicate bridge at the party. All proceeds from the entry fees were given to the Friends. In addition to the proceeds from the entry fees, a "50/50" raffle was held in which the winner won half and the Friends won half of the pot that was collected. The event was very successful and people asked when they could have it again. By popular demand, the Bridge Party will now be an annual fundraiser for the Friends.



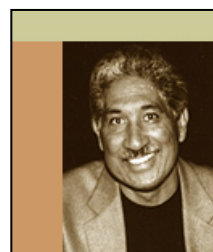
Author Events

Our activities highlighted the fact that literacy is not only about reading but also about writing. In keeping with one aspect of the mission of the Friends, to promote literacy, the Friends held three author events.



The first Author Event presented **Jackie Peters Cully's** newly published book "Journeying: The Colours of Our Pathways," held on October 16, 2010 at the library. Jackie, a local

artist and senior, released her first book which is a semi- autobiographical collection of her major body of work. The book contains collages that trace the African-American experience from the "Door of No Return" in Africa through the times of slavery, the Underground Railroad, the Great Migration to the Hot Jazz of Harlem. Jackie Cully is a ground-breaker, the first Black textile designer on Fifth Avenue whose life and work is profiled in the book. The living history embodied by Jackie and her work is a fitting contribution to the body of knowledge about the African American experience in particular as well as the universal human experience



The second Author Event was a book discussion by **Dr. Robert Greer**, a multi-talented mystery writer and author who is also a physician and dentist. Dr. Greer's presentation on

December 30, 2011 was preceded by a Kwanzaa candle lighting, the third annual Kwanzaa lighting and book signing sponsored by the Friends. Dr. Greer traveled from Colorado to visit friends in Sarasota who helped organize the event. The presentation focused on Dr. Greer's newest work "First of State" a prequel to his very popular C J Floyd mystery series. The discussion was wide-ranging from the content of this particular book and why he wrote it now, to how characters were developed, the use of place in the settings of the work and his process of writing.



The Third Author Event was a reading and discussion by **Leita Kaldi**, a former Peace Corps Volunteer (PCV) and author of her memoir about her three year service in Senegal.

Roller Skating in the Desert is a compilation of stories about Ms. Kaldi's Experiences as a 55 year old PCV woman working in Africa.

Accompanied by photos, paintings and books as well as Peace Corps brochures and posters, Ms. Kaldi's presentation included reading excerpts from the book, expansion on the stories and answers to questions from the audience which included other former PCVs.

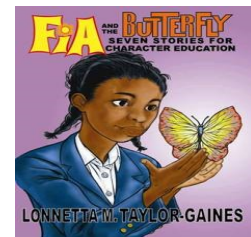
